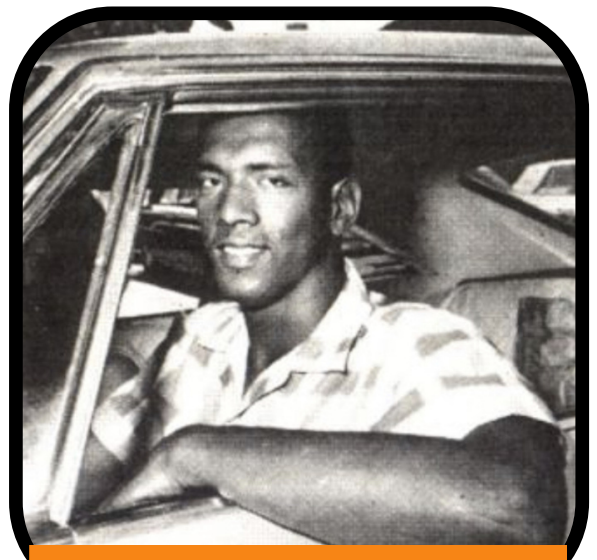

The Rape of Recy Taylor

In 1944, Recy Taylor, a 24-year-old black mother and sharecropper, was gang raped by six white boys in Alabama. Fearless, Recy identified her rapists and fought for justice. Learn about this incredible woman who stood up for herself in the Jim Crow South, paving the way for women's rights everywhere.



A Crime on the Bayou

In 1966, Gary Duncan, a young Black fisherman, tried to break up a fight between white and Black teenagers outside a newly integrated school in Louisiana. He was arrested and faced a long battle with the racist legal system. This film covers his fight, which enshrined the Constitutional right to a jury trial at the state level.
