Andrew Kerr Shay

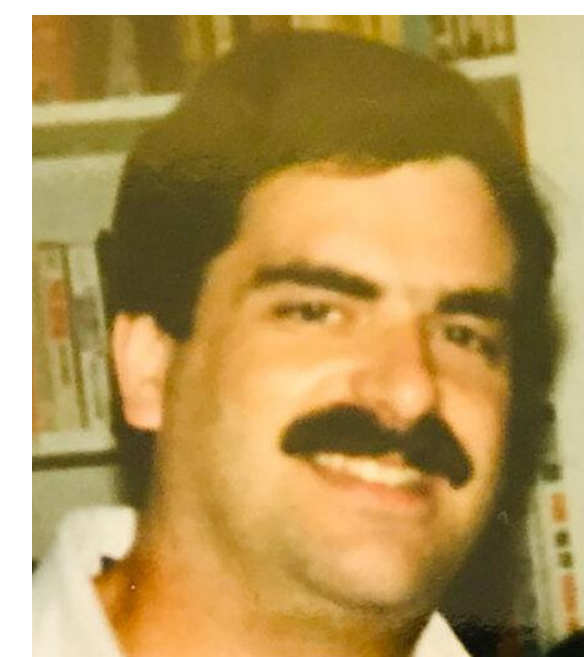
March 14, 1955- March 12, 1985 (29)

His real name was Thomas Andrew Kerr Shay. The "Thomas" part of his name was added some time after his birth to satisfy his grandmother who wanted his grandfather to be memorialized. No one ever called him Thomas, sometimes he was known as Andrew or Andy but everyone called him Kerry after his middle name.

Kerry grew up in the Swarthmore school system, starting in kindergarten. In the fall of 1970 he transferred to Westtown boarding school in West Chester. Although he was no longer enrolled in the Swarthmore/ Rutledge school system he remained close to his friends there.

After Westtown he began his freshman year at Antioch. About this time he came out - in an era that was not friendly to gay people. Antioch constrained him and he left to pursue his dreams as an actor in New York City. He had a series of jobs in the food industry, searching for his lucky break. Tragically, the AIDS crisis roared through the city and Kerry was one of the early casualties. He died just prior to his 30th birthday. His friends and family still mourn his early passing.

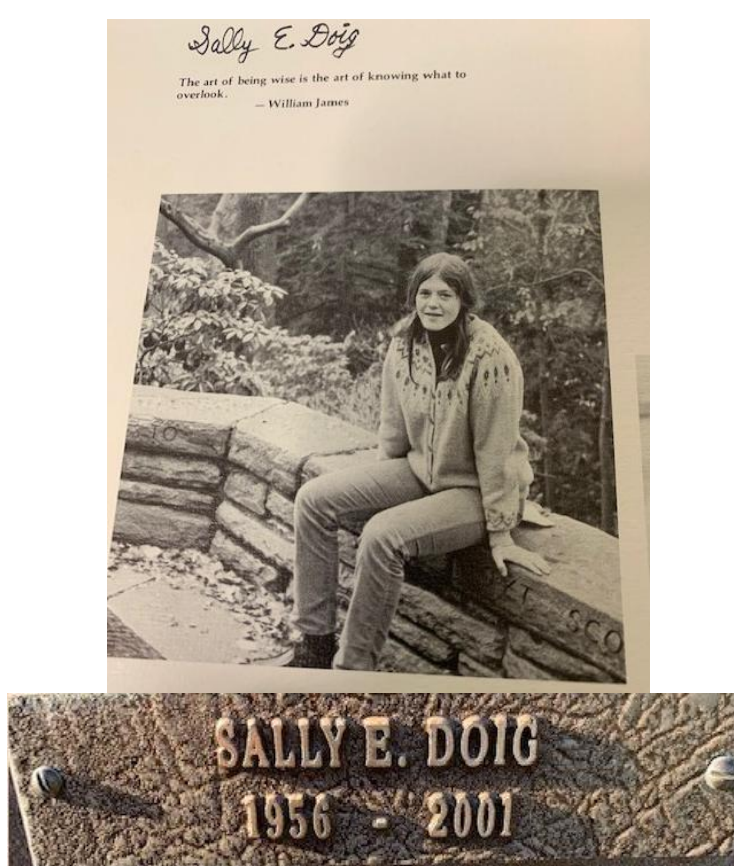
Macfarlane Hoffman

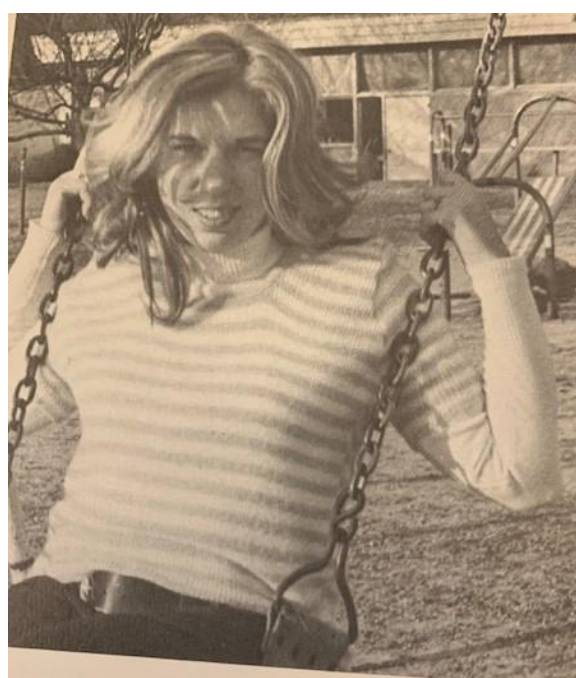

Richard was born to John B. and Barbara Koelle, in Colorado Springs, CO. He grew up in Swarthmore, PA. There he was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church and graduated from Swarthmore High School in 1973. He studied at Widener University and Hamilton College. Richard obtained his degree in Anthropology from Hamilton where he was a member of the Emerson Literary Society.

Rich returned to Pennsylvania to begin his career. On August 13, 1983 he married Valerie M. Jones, Hamilton Class of 1980. In 1986 Richard obtained his J.D. degree from Delaware Law School and was subsequently associated with law firms in Philadelphia and Media, PA where he last resided.

A huge fan of Monty Python and among National Public Radio's most devoted listeners, Rich also took great pleasure in reading science fiction. He was fond of Sherlock Holmes stories and a member of the Sons of the Copper Beaches. Given to outbursts of wit (he once listed his undergraduate activities as "varsity ping-pong" on an alumni questionnaire), he was a writer of considerable talent.

Afflicted with a brain tumor, which had gone undiagnosed, Richard died at the age of 46 in Swarthmore. In addition to his parents he is survived by his beloved children, son, Spencer, and daughter, Lucy as well as two sisters, Katherine and Susan Koelle.

Graham was active in the Rutledge Fire Company, becoming President. Graham entered the United States Air Force. He finished Fire Fighter training at Chanute Air Force Base in IL. He was then stationed at K. I. Sawyer AFB in Michigan before serving at RAF Woodbridge in England.

Following his service in the military, Graham moved to Arizona. He was an aviator at Hughes/McDonnell Douglass/Boeing Helicopters. Graham spec'd out a Boeing Helicopter crash truck. He drove it back from Wisconsin - with ample supplies of brats and beer. Graham was also an active member of Maricopa Mountain Rescue. One memorable life moment was when Graham met Arnold Palmer - and offered advice on improving his golf game! 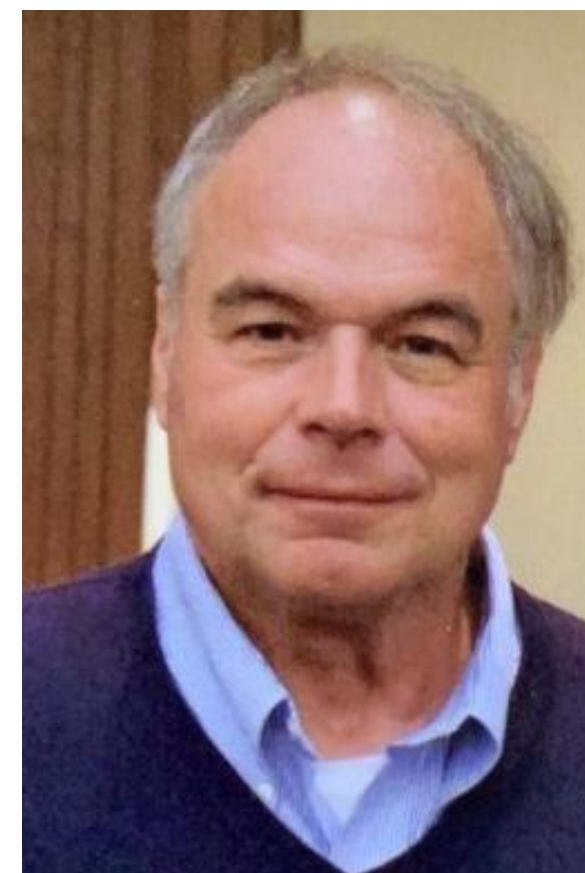
David Griffith Raymond

After a 30-plus year career, during which he led the company's significant growth, he retired in 2006.

In the 1970s, David began a long love affair with Montana's Bitterroot Valley. Long summer breaks from his college food service job allowed his adventurous spirit to soar. Times spent flying his single-engine plane, living in a teepee and a job as a trail cook for an outfitter were some of his fondest memories. For over 30 years David, his family, and friends enjoyed precious time together there. In Kansas City, David was an avid supporter of the arts, the Kansas City Chiefs and was a proud member of the Young Presidents' Organization (Omega Forum). David was preceded in death by his parents and his son Andrew. He is survived by his wife Barbara, children Blair and Christopher, and brothers Timothy (Marylyn), John (Laurie), Jeffrey (Melinna) Matthew (Severina) plus beloved nieces and nephews.
