Program Overview

Lead a short-term, immersive study abroad program in the Dominican Republic centered on the course: “The Sociology of Crossing Cultures” (3 credits). This program blends academic instruction with experiential learning, allowing students to engage directly with local communities, institutions, and cultural systems.

Academic Structure

- 3 credits (in partnership with Gratz College)
- Flexible syllabus (aligned with Sociology / related fields)
- Pre-departure + in-country + Post-trip
- Faculty-led academic instruction

- Serve as faculty leader
- Guide pre-trip, trip, and post-trip academic discussions and student reflection
- Integrate field experiences into course learning
- No responsibility for logistics or program operations
- Grading student work

Teacher Support

- 8 days with pre and post sessions
